

Helpful Strategies

- Decide which process (Pvt, Foster or Kinship)
- Recognize and "Accept" the "Perfect" child doesn't exist
- Get as much info as you can about the child
- Use the "history" given to project the future needs

Your age

Other Children

Access/Availability of your time

Age of children seeking

 Know that you can make requests re (adopt and stipend or other special needs) before finalization of adoption What changes after finalization of adoption such as:

Resources(agencies)


Access to services

Stipend


Family Access(if necessary)

Lisa's Truths by way of Experience

- Advanced Preparation is required
- Adoption will be/is most rewarding experience of your life
- Know your community and what's available to support your child(ren)
- Do not be afraid to ask questions
- There are known and unknown challenges to adoption

- Personal growth and emotional growth are required to be accessible with adoption
- You will not be able to LOVE your children well
- Do not move forward until you find inner peace
- SHHH! Have no fear! You are CRAZY!!!!!


- Lisa's Internal Conversation
