














Terminology and Latino/a/x Identity

Role of race and gender discrimination and anti-immigrant bias








A culture of silence, stigma, and shame in schools leaves students feeling unsupported and pushes them into invisibility.



Negatively impacting—or being harmfully indifferent to— Latina/x mental health results in school pushout.






- 1. The entire **school culture** needs to change to prioritize student wellness.
- 2. Students need to feel affirmed in school curriculum and be represented in teaching and counseling staff.
- 3. Students need to be taught their **rights** so they can get the **accommodations** they need.

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Teachers can protect students' rights

Everyone has a role to play in building better school climates for Latina & Latinx students

School leaders should:

 Build a culture of respect in their schools that acknowledges students' mental health concerns

District leaders should:

- ✓ Incorporate mental health check-ins in established screenings
- make sure educators are trained to support students

Lawmakers should:

- ✓ Fund programs that create more Latinx educators and mental health professionals of color
- ✓ Require schools to teach students of their rights under state and federal law

Students, parents & community members should:

- ✓ Voice their concerns to school leaders and elected officials at school board meetings & city council hearings
- ✓ Hold their elected officials accountable!

Recommendations for Schools

- 1. Mental health **training** (Mental Health First Aid) for school staff
- 2. A mental health break space
- 3. Peer support circles
- 4. More Latina/x and women teachers and counselors
- 5. Working with **community groups** to provide schoolbased mental health support
- 6. Changing the dress code
- 7. Representation in school curriculum
- 8. Anonymous stress surveys
- 9. Teaching students their **rights**









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
