

## Secure Detention by Race and Ethnicity

For secure detention, the statewide rate of disproportionality is more significant, with Black Non-Hispanic youth comprising 58.4% of all secure detention admissions in 2013. When excluding Philadelphia and Allegheny County, Hispanic and Black Non-Hispanic youth represent approximately 15% and 40%, respectively, of all





secure detention admissions. In Philadelphia, 72.3% of secure detention admissions involved Black Non-Hispanic youth and 17.2% involved Hispanic youth. In Allegheny County, 80.8% of secure detention admissions involved Black Non-Hispanic youth.

The statewide RRIs for secure detention indicate that Black Non-Hispanic youth were admitted to secure detention at more than 2½ times the rate of White Non-Hispanic youth and Hispanic youth were admitted at almost ½ times the rate of White Non-Hispanic youth.








