- At 9:08am, Monica welcomed everyone, took attendance, and reviewed the agenda.
 - We welcomed Tita Atte, Evaluator from Drexel University for the Garrett Lee Smith Suicide Prevention Grant to the Subcommittee and all members introduced themselves
 - Asked for celebrations...
 - Monica celebrated the acceptance of the proposals at the Tampa Conference...

- 30th Annual Research & Policy Conference on Child, Adolescent, and Young Adult Behavioral Health Proposals were accepted! Conference is March 5-8 in Tampa, Florida
 - How Data Comes to Life: Inspiring Data-driven Wraparound Coaching with Youth and Family Peer Supports using Data Dashboards
 - 30-minute workshop that I am doing with Dan Fisher and Artheria Taggart from the Delaware County HFW Team
 - Positive Functional Outcomes in Pennsylvania Youth and Families after 12 and 24 months of High Fidelity Wraparound
 - Poster presentation that Will McKenna and I are doing on behalf of YFTI
 - Visualization of Youth Engagement and Outcomes Data
 - 90-minute workshop that Will McKenna and I are doing in partnership with the Healthy Transitions Evaluation Teams of Utah and Kentucky
- Karen Jenkins, Lex Gingell, and Kelsey Leonard were unable to make the call so Monica gave a brief overview of the PA Healthy Transitions Partnership and the processes/services that the grant seeks to evaluate.
- We looked at the Healthy Transitions page of the PA SOC

- Reviewed the HT data dashboards that we have been working on to get some feedback and direction.
 - Looked at the Program Oversight dashboards – enrollment, system involvement, referral sources, and different descriptive and demographic dashboards were shown.
 - Reviewed the menu of dashboards about Mental Health and Substance Use – diagnoses, services, suicide, trauma, and drug use were shown. Many of the dashboards have filters that allow users to select grant year, county, agency, and a host of demographic characteristics to look for any disproportionalities in the enrollment data.
 - Reviewed the Outcomes dashboards around Social Connectedness, Daily Functioning, Psychological Distress, and Perception of Care.
 - Irina build 3-4 dashboards for each indicator that shows summary information, threshold for having a positive/negative outcome, and symptoms – both all on one page or in a selectable list.
 - The dashboards that we create for HT will be our template for how we create dashboards for System of Care outcomes and High Fidelity Wraparound Outcomes so it is important to get ideas and make sure we are displaying information in a user-friendly way.
 - Mark addressed the issue of being able to compare planning processes and connect indicators across grants for the SLMT.
 - Jill talked about the difference between broad data and detailed information that is easier to use – complimented the E-team on discussion and displaying the difference
 - Maria talked about how data brings up further questions about the time of year, medications, treatment, etc. so that we interpret data in a context. We discussed how the providers will be able to use this tool along with the medical record and case chart to be most effective.
 - Wendy P. remarked that they were easy to use and understand.
 - Wendy L. asked for the forms to be sent around to review how we collect the data and discussed how to interpret data when youth appear to worsen before they get better or don't reveal all of the concerns in the beginning of treatment.

- Mark Durgin will be leading the February meeting and asking for feedback about the SOC brochures that are being created as an overview and for different audiences of youth, family and system partners. We will send around the brochure so you can review and come to the next meeting with feedback.
- Monica thanked everyone and the meeting was adjourned at 10:27am.
