 - Perspectives on Local Services System after 6 months
 - Participation in Treatment-This is beyond Treatment for BH, but system involvement.
 - Dr. Hodas feels this is very good data, and maybe it should be broken out more, and not grouped together.
 - All agreed that this data will be helpful to break out and even putting some pre during and post data in possible.
 - Social Connectedness is great data for youth to help engage youth in the process.
 - Outcomes are Important
 - One member talked about how the data can be used – if you see 41% probation system involvement but low numbers of those system partners participating on the team meetings then that can help you discuss and engage at the Leadership Team.
 - One member suggested having each partner type give perspectives on what accounts for the positive info on the slide and what accounts for the negative info on the slide.
 - One member talked about what youth want to see – what is in it for me, will I be more social, will I have more friends, etc. They want to be better off and want to feel more engaged so how do we use data to show that?
 - One member talked about the family perspective as being a little more cynical or harder to recognize changes in youth based on the data on the last slide.
 - We talked about making a tip sheet for how counties can use data and discuss data from different perspectives.
 - The next meeting will continue this discussion as we prepare for the Learning Institutes.
